## REGISTRATION

The event is open to all amateur permit holders of the local Federation and to the PEUGEOT dealer's guests, and/or qualifying rounds winners. All players should have the 2009 membership permit.

## GAME FORMULAS

INDEX: 00-24,4; 18 holes Stroke-play  
24,5-36,4; 18 holes Stableford

## GAME ORDER

The tee off is drawn in increasing handicap order. In the case of a game taking place over 2 days (Saturday and Sunday) the participants can play, either on Saturday or on Sunday, to their convenience. They should indicate it on the registration sheet. If the weather conditions are not the same in Saturday and Sunday, no participant will be entitled to any claim to the Event Committee.

## PRIZE AND REWARD PRESENTATION

The Net prevails on the Gross. Several Prizes cannot go to one single person.

Will be rewarded:

1°/ The best 2 Net scores and the best Gross score in Men series (00-17,4 and 17,5-24,4), Women series (00-24,4) and Mixed series (24,5-36,4).

2°/ The best Net score and the best Gross score in the Senior Men series (00-24,4) and Senior Women series (00-24,4).

No prize should exceed £ 500 (750 € or 750 US\$) in accordance with the amateur status rules (rule 3-2a) set by the Royal & Ancient. If the winner does not appear at the prize presentation, then the prize will be lost to that winner, and will go to the next player down. If the winner who is qualified for the Peugeot International PRO-AM does not appear, his/her qualification will not be lost.

## TIE

In the event of a tie, the last 9 holes will be compared, then the last 6 holes, then the 3 last holes. If the tie remains, the scores are to be compared hole by hole in reverse (17, 15, 14, 12, 11...).

## QUALIFICATION FOR THE PEUGEOT INTERNATIONAL PRO-AM

At the end of the National Final, the players qualified for the PEUGEOT INTERNATIONAL PRO-AM 2009 will be the man and woman born on or before 1987 whose handicap is less than or equal to 24,4 with the best Net score at the overall placing and residing in the organising country.

Any man or woman who played the Peugeot International PRO-AM, as PCC finalist, in the 2 last years (2007 and 2008), can not be qualified for the 2009 PRO-AM.

This competition will take place in Paris and will be played in PRO-AM from Tuesday, August the 25th to Thursday, August the 27th. THE PEUGEOT INTERNATIONAL PRO-AM will be played on two of the most prestigious golf courses of the Parisian area: Saint-Germain en Laye and Joyenval.

## CONTESTS

**THE PEUGEOT HOLE IN ONE:** PEUGEOT will offer a special prize to the first player who does a par 3 hole designated by the Event Committee in one stroke.

**THE NEAREST TO THE PIN CONTEST:** A board will be placed near the green of the hole designated by the Event Committee. The man or woman player leaving first will announce his or her name and the distance from the ball to the hole (after the first stroke). Any player whose ball, in one stroke, lands closer to the hole than the player written down last, should mark his or her name and the distance. The nearest to the pin contest will be held on a par 3 hole designated by the Event Committee.

The winner of the accuracy contest will be the last woman or man player written down on the list. He or she will receive a special prize.

**THE LONGEST DRIVE CONTEST:** On the hole designated by the Event Committee, a board will be planted near the tee off area (men and women). The first man and woman player to go will write his or her name on the board and plant it at his or her stroke length. Any man or woman player whose ball, after the first stroke, goes further than the board should write down his or her name on the board and move it to the spot where his or her ball has landed. The winners (men and woman) of the longest drive will be the last woman and the last man player written down on the board. They will each receive a special prize. Balls in the rough and semi-rough are not taken into account. No prize should exceed £ 500 (750 € or 750 US\$) in accordance with the amateur status rules (rule 3-2a) set by the Royal & Ancient.
